

GRMT SUMMER COURSE POLICY AND SAFETY GUIDE

SECTION 1: STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

Students are responsible for their own behavior and safety at all times while participating in the summer course. This includes following all safety rules and regulations, as well as being aware of their surroundings and taking precautions to avoid injury.

SECTION 2: CONSEQUENCES OF UNSAFE BEHAVIOR

Students who engage in unsafe behavior may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including expulsion from the summer course. This includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Disregarding safety rules and regulations.
- 2. Engaging in horseplay or other activities that could lead to injury.
- 3. Being under the influence of alcohol or drugs

SECTION 3: INJURED STUDENTS

If a student is injured while participating in the summer course, the staff will provide immediate medical attention. The student's parent or guardian will be notified as soon as possible.

In the event of an injury that is the result of the student's own unsafe behaviour, the student or their parent or guardian may be responsible for the cost of medical treatment if/where needed.

SECTION 4: WAIVER OF LIABILITY

By participating in the GRMT Summer Course, students and their parents or guardians agree to waive any and all claims against the summer course, its staff, and its facilities for any injuries that may occur while participating in the course.

This policy is intended to ensure the safety of all students participating in the GRMT Summer Course. By following the rules and regulations outlined in this policy, students can help to prevent injuries and have a safe and enjoyable summer experience.
